The Integrated English Foundation has been designed for students who academically just miss the entry requirement for an undergraduate degree and do not yet have the required English language level. It will help you to improve your English and academic skills before starting your chosen undergraduate degree at Anglia Ruskin University.

During the first semester of the course you will primarily focus on improving your reading, writing, speaking and listening skills by studying the following modules:

- Introduction to Language and Concepts in Higher Education
- Analysis of Academic Texts
- Interactive Learning Skills and Communications
- Research Report

The second semester will introduce modules relevant to your chosen degree, giving you the opportunity to practice your language skills in context.
